



### EXAMPLE QUALITY SNAPSHOT CHART

The chart style shown in Figure 2 is an example of how trends can be displayed both across time, and between age and sex groups. Setting standardised scoring criteria for different indicators allows for quick visual analysis of overall quality gaps.

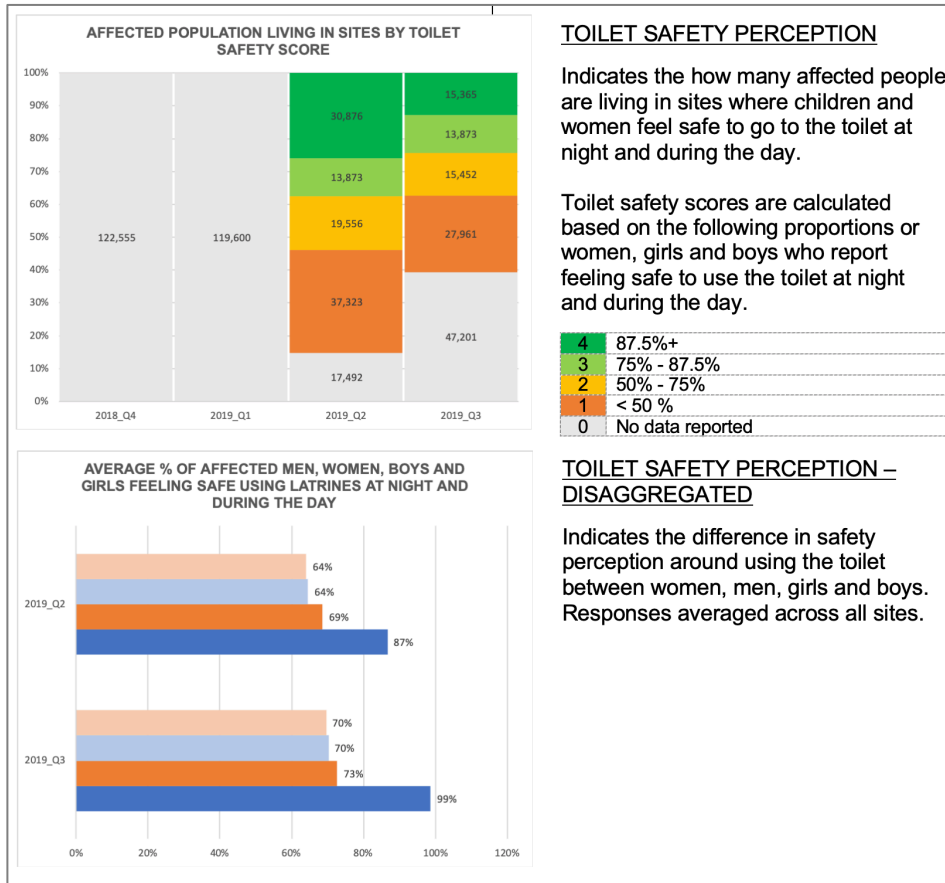


Figure 1: Example excerpt from Quality Snapshot Myanmar

The chart shows the number of people living in sites with each quality score as well as the proportion of the total targeted population. Data gaps are highlighted to demonstrate where there is insufficient information to be able to calculate the quality score. Where scores are used, the limits of each score should be defined based on targets and minimum standards set in the SOF. Scores should be somewhat consistent across indicators in terms of what each represents, for example:

- 0: No / insufficient data reported
- 1: Significantly below minimum standard
- 2: Marginally below minimum standard
- 3: Marginally above minimum standard
- 4: Target reached
